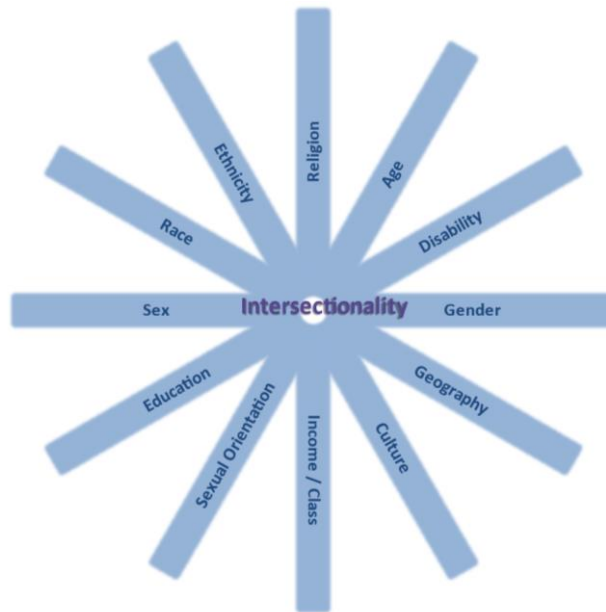


## Intersectionality Slide : Example Disabled Women



### Disabled Women Outcomes ages 16-59 - Domestic Abuse & Violence

- 3.5 x more likely to die of COVID-19 (ONS)
- Anxiety levels: 4.47 out of 10 (2.91 for their enabled peers)
- Experienced twice rate of Domestic Abuse & Violence in 2020 than their enabled peers
- Those with social/emotional, mental health, learning impairments experienced the highest levels of DV 2020
- 2015-2018 England & Wales study found that 5.7% disabled women were victims of sexual assault once or **more** (3%): social/behavioural 9%, MH 7%, learning 6%
